Héctor Hugo Almanza Reyes, Legal Representative for Centro Médico Bariátrico de Tijuana S.C., owner of Grand View Hospital, capacity already acknowledged in case file referred in the above right hand side of this instrument, stating as domicile to hear and receive all notices the one located at Calle Ernesto Sarmiento 2308, Colonia Burocrata Ruiz Cortinez, Tijuana, Baja California, 22406 and authorizing to hear and receive them Attorney Martha Lilia Morales Sanchez, before this authority, I appear to state the following:

F A C T S

1. That on December 03, 2018, sanitary inspection order 18-SS-E-02-TJ-158-C-V, to carry out an inspection visit to the establishment known as Grand View Hospital, owned by the party I represent, to verify among other things the presence of nosocomial infections, carrying out the sampling procedure pursuant to articles 401 bis and 401 bis-2 of the Ley General de Salud [“General Health Law”].
2. That on February 25, 2019 a Final Ruling was issued by Director de Control Sanitario de ISESALUD [“Director of Sanitary Control of ISESALUD [“Institute of Public Health Services”], by which the correction of certain aspects of the report consisting in filing of some documents such as manuals, protocols and pending registration ledgers was ordered.
3. That in recent days, we have detected the existence of a CDC “Centers for Disease Control and Prevention” alert, in which it recommends not to practice any surgeries in the hospital owned by the party I represent until confirmation by the Mexican authorities regarding the presence of a bacteria named *pseudomonas aeruginosa*.
4. That no part of the Ruling issued by said authority or the report that serves as support for it, mentions that evidence of any nosocomial infection was found, much less of the bacteria named *pseudomonas aeruginosa*.
5. Regarding the result of the inspection, it only contains minor observations that have already been corrected according to the documents we attach once again to this instrument.
